Alumni Association UPDATE

Dear Fellow Alumni:

Homecoming for 2008 is scheduled for Saturday, October 11. We are hoping for a large turnout for this year's reunion with class reunions being planned for the classes of 1948, 1958, 1963, 1968, 1978, and 1983. Please make plans to contact your classmates and encourage them to attend this year. Information on class reunions is on the following pages.

Our annual fundraiser has gone well with 360 donors contributing \$15,535 as of August 23. Please be reminded that your contributions are tax deductible. Some will wait until either Homecoming or the end of the calendar year to make their annual donation. All of us deeply appreciate the support shown by each contributing alumnus.

Currently, there are a number of major projects that the Board of Directors is considering to be accomplished over the next year. Following a detailed inspection of the Alumni House it is evident that a number of repairs need to be carried out. These will be broken into three categories: a) immediate repairs, b) repairs that can be made later (after homecoming), c) repairs that though noted may not be necessary. Most of this is important and is needed but we need to spread the work out over several months in order to allow for donations and to use the interest from the CD's to finance the work.

Also, following Homecoming, we will determine when to begin replacing the War Memorial. This will require a large amount of money to be paid prior to the replacement of the three panels (not the base), and the remainder to be paid upon completion. The Board will select one of the three bids submitted for the work.

We need to do some extensive landscaping around the Alumni House including re-

moval of the mulch and replacement of a number of plants. For the past two years, extremely dry weather has taken its toll. It is possible that most of this can be delayed until after Homecoming.

Finally, internal repairs to the Alumni House prior to Homecoming will include, sheet rocking and painting the ceiling in the kitchen and patching and painting in the downstairs bathroom. The remainder of the interior work as mentioned in the June Newsletter can be completed later to include work in the Cum Honore plaque room, the Military room, and the downstairs hallway.

Just recently a complete restoration of the tiger in front of the Alumni House was completed at a cost of \$1500. Repair work on the wheels of the cannon and painting will soon follow.

Registration for Homecoming will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the registration tent behind the Alumni House. Our picnic luncheon will be on the same site. Parking is available behind Main Building, across the street from the Alumni House, and in the parking lot of the old Library building. The Alumni House will be open early Saturday morning, October 11, as well as on Friday, October 10, so that you may visit classmates and see the displays inside the house.

Our picnic luncheon will begin at 11:00 a.m. with Chester Jordan's Catering serving for the 19th consecutive year. All of you will want to take the opportunity to visit with former faculty and staff who are invited to the luncheon as our guests. The \$15 cost per person will cover your lunch as well as our guests. Reservations are required so that we can give the caterer a correct headcount.

Our Alumni meeting will follow the luncheon. With the conclusion of the Alumni meeting we will then move to the War Memorial in front of Main for our annual memorial service and wreath laying. Following that, class reunion pictures as well as group pictures will be taken on the steps of Main. Our morning and afternoon activities should be concluded around 3:00 p.m.

The evening dinner event will be held at the Castle Heights Chop House which is located on the Heights campus. Castle Heights Chop House restaurant is in the former President's home located across from Main Building which is now Lebanon City Hall. The dinner will cost \$40 per person. The Chop House will be closed to the public the night of our dinner (Saturday, October 11). We will have a choice of a chicken dish, salmon, or prime-rib for dinner. The Castle Heights Chop House will open to our alumni before the dinner dance from 1:00 to 4:30 p.m. They will not be serving any food items from their menu during this time, however, the lounge/bar area will be open as they will be preparing for our dinner.
