Dear Fellow Alumni:

Homecoming for 2010 is scheduled for Saturday, October 9. Again, we are hoping for a large turnout for this year's reunion with class reunions being planned for the classes of **1955, 1960, 1965, 1970, 1975, 1980, and 1985.** Although there is no one planning a 60th reunion for the Class of **1950**, we hope that those alumni from '50 will attend Homecoming and participate in our regular events planned for Saturday. Please make plans to contact your classmates and encourage them to attend this year. **Information on the class reunions is on page 3 of this newsletter and lists details and contact information.**

Our annual fundraiser that began with the June 2010 newsletter is behind in the number of donors and contributions compared with last year. So far we have 317 donors who have contributed \$14,000.13 as of August 19. **Please be reminded that your contributions are tax deductible.** If you have not sent in your dues/contribution yet, please consider doing so. We realize that some of you will wait until either Homecoming or the end of the calendar year to make your annual donation. All of us deeply appreciate the support shown by each contributing alumnus.

We will be dedicating the new panels on the War Memorial at Homecoming. Bobby Bradley's (Class of 1960) name was added to the Memorial to those lost during the Vietnam War. We will have a formal ceremony in honor and in memory of Bobby at Homecoming which will coincide with the 50 year reunion of his class.

We still have copies of our book, **Hail, Castle Heights!** available. You will find an order form with this mailing. The cost is \$20 if purchased at Homecoming and \$25 if ordered by mail to cover postage. We en-

courage you to purchase this book for the first time or to have additional copies to give to your family. You might consider placing a copy in your local library. We have Bookplates available and will provide these to you upon request.

At our last Board meeting in July our chief topic of discussion was the Strategic Plan as mentioned in earlier newsletters. The Board voted to adopt the plan and I will be updating you at homecoming and in newsletters to follow.

I am asking if anyone would be interested in sponsoring the cost for the 2 tents, tables and chairs that we use for the Luncheon at Homecoming. The cost is around \$2,900. The cost

Our Homecoming events for 2010 include tours of Main Building, now Lebanon City Hall, and the City of Lebanon Museum and History Center which is located in the basement of Main. City of Lebanon Mayor, Philip Craighead, and his staff are to be thanked for allowing us to visit both of these facilities.

Registration for Homecoming will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the registration tent behind the Alumni House. Our picnic luncheon will be on the same site. Parking is available behind Main Building, across the street from the Alumni House, and in the

parking lot of the old Library building. The Alumni House will be open early Saturday morning, October 9, as well as on Friday, October 8, so that you may visit classmates and see the displays inside the house.

Our picnic luncheon will begin at 11:00 a.m. with Chester Jordan's Catering serving for the 21st consecutive year. All of you will want to take the opportunity to visit with former faculty and staff who are invited to the luncheon as our guests. The \$15 cost per person will cover your lunch as well as our guests. **Reservations are required** so that we can give the caterer a correct headcount.

Our Alumni meeting will follow the luncheon. With the conclusion of the Alumni meeting we will then move to the War Memorial in front of Main for our annual memorial service and wreath laying. Following that, class reunion pictures as well as group pictures will be taken on the steps of Main. Our morning and afternoon activities should be concluded around 2:30 p.m.

For the fourth year, our evening dinner event will be held at the Castle Heights Chop House located on the Heights campus. The dinner will cost \$40 per person. The Chop House will be closed to the public the night of our dinner (Saturday, October 9). We will have an entree choice of a chicken dish, salmon, or prime-rib. The Castle Heights Chop House will open to our alumni before the dinner from 1:00 to 4:30 p.m. They will not be serving any food from their menu during this time, however, the lounge/bar area will be open as they will be preparing for our dinner.

At Homecoming under the registration tent we will have for sale, coffee cups, Heights sweatshirts, t-shirts (both short-sleeve and long sleeve), golf shirts, baseball caps, license plates, pennants, Castle Heights brass buttons, school logo emblems (patch) to be used on blazers, tote bags, and travel bags, and lapel pins (miniatures of the hat shield on our garrison hat). Also for sale will be the numbered color prints of the Heights campus, circa 1916, for \$35, a panoramic print of the campus taken during the 30's for \$35, and a new this year is an 11 X 14 picture of the tiger and cannon in front of the Alumni House taken by Gary Moor '59 (Gary is a Master Photographer) for \$25. We will have the book, **HAIL, CASTLE HEIGHTS!** on sale for \$20.
