Dear Fellow Alumni:

Homecoming for 2022 is scheduled for Saturday, October 8. Again, we are hoping for a large turnout for this year's Homecoming with class reunions for the classes of **1972, 1977, and 1982.** An official reunion has not been confirmed for **1962, 1967, or 1987.** Please make plans to contact your classmates and encourage them to attend this year. **Information on the class reunions is on page 3 of this newsletter.**

From May 28, 2022 to August 13, 2022 our fundraisers have brought in \$7,900 for the Library Fund, and \$19,015 for the General Fund. We have received donations from 197 alumni. **If you have not sent in your contribution yet, please consider doing so. Contributions are IRS tax deductible.** All of us deeply appreciate the support shown by each contributing alumnus.

Our Homecoming events for 2022, include tours of Main Building (Lebanon City Hall), and the City of Lebanon Museum and History Center located in the basement of Lebanon City Hall from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Mayor Rick Bell, and his staff are graciously allowing us to visit both of these facilities and we thank them for their assistance on Saturday, October 8. The Rutherford Parks Library will be open at 9:30 a.m. through 2:30 p.m. on Homecoming Day, October 8. **(See insert on Homecoming Activities.)**

Registration for Homecoming will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the registration tent next to the Rutherford Parks Library. Our picnic luncheon will be on the same site. Parking is available in front of the Library, in the grassy area next to the luncheon tent, behind Main Building, and the parking lot across the

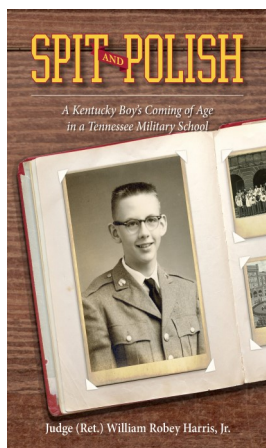
