Dear Fellow Alumni:

Homecoming for 2024 is scheduled for Saturday, October 12. Again, we are hoping for a large turnout for this year's Homecoming with class reunions for the classes of 1959, 1964, 1969, 1974, 1979, and 1984. From May 2 to August 17, 2024 our fundraisers have brought in \$4,630 for the Library Fund, and \$13,000 for the General Fund. We have received donations from 158 alumni. If you have not mailed in your contribution, please consider doing so. Contributions are IRS tax deductible. All of us deeply appreciate the support shown by each contributing alumnus.
